10. REGULAR ITEMS

a. Washroom at Roads Garage

WHEREAS as further proposal for replacement/upgrading of the washroom at the Roads Garage has been received from Coopers Plumbing,

AND WHEREAS there is an urgent need to provide indoor washroom facilities for the Roads staff as the current facilities are unusable during the winter months as the waste pipeline freezes due to its location;

BE IT RESOLVED that Council approves the quote received from Coopers Plumbing dated March 1, 2022 in the amount of \$9950.00 for the installation of a new washroom area located in the southeast corner of the office building, including cutting and jackhammering the concrete and removal of excess, tieing drain into the main sewer line, installing all necessary plumbing drains and vents in floor, repour the concrete to a rough level trowelling and supply fixtures: shower, toilet, vanity/sink and hot water tank, regulated heat trace for outside water line; and that the work should commence as soon as feasibly possible – subject to weather conditions and ability to dig the connecting infrastructure. Township staff will coordinate the digging, electrical installation, room construction and permit.

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b. Triangle Seniors' Club Lottery Licence

c. Townline Road Bridge

WHEREAS the CAO for the Municipality of Central Manitoulin advises that they are proposing to spend their Northern Ontario Resource Development Support (NORDS) Fund allotment on replacing Bridge #4 on TownLine Road which is shared with the Township of Tehkummah;

AND WHEREAS the Ontario Structure Inspection Manual ("OSIM") indicates that a Major Rehabilitation of this bridge is recommended within 1 to 5 years;

AND WHEREAS Central Manitoulin has provided an updated budget estimate from Tim Lee of Northern Mat and Bridge dated November 30, 2021 in the amount of \$379,993.89 (\$336,277.78 + \$43,716.11 HST) for a Lessard bridge;

AND WHEREAS this new estimate has increased in cost by \$166,348.80 from the one received in January of 2021 due to supply chain issues and high demand resulting in volatile pricing and increases of up to 41% since the start of 2021;

AND WHEREAS the Township of Tehkummah has received \$64,101.89 in funding under the NORDS program for the 2021-2022 fiscal year and the same amount will be available for the 2022-2023 fiscal year for a total of \$128,203.78;

AND WHEREAS this project will need to be tendered;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council approves using the funds from the NORDS Fund in the amount of \$128,203.78 to pay for the cost of the bridge replacement and allocate the remainder of the funds needed from the 2022 budget. The Roads Superintendents from Central and Tehkummah should work together to provide any assistance on the project in an effort to reduce the cost by doing any digging or preliminary work.

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d. Application to Establish Cemetery

WHEREAS a request has been received from Daniel Zehr and Lloyd Albrecht, members of the Amish community, for the establishment of a cemetery in the Township of Tehkummah:

AND WHEREAS the property owner of Conc 4, Lot 11 on the 10th Sideroad is willing to donate one acre of land for the Cemetery;

AND WHEREAS the land to be donated is currently zoned Prime Agriculture, Agriculture and Rural:

AND WHEREAS the zoning requires the location of the cemetery to be on the southeast corner of Conc 4, Lot 11 which is designated Rural on Schedule B of Tehkummah's Zoning Bylaw 80-02;

AND WHEREAS the donated land needs to be severed from the main parcel of land, have a separate entrance from the 10th Sideroad, and be owned by another entity other than the current landowner;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council approves the request for the establishment of a cemetery for the Amish community, to be located on the southeast portion of the property zoned as Rural; that a portion of the land be severed and a separate entrance permit be obtained; that all required approvals are obtained from the Manitoulin Planning Board and the Bereavement Authority of Ontario before the start of construction for this project; and that the community work in conjunction with the Township office and the Building Inspector and Bylaw Officer to ensure compliance with any Municipal By-laws, Ministry guidelines, regulations and legislation regarding the establishment of a cemetery in the Province of Ontario.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council approves the establishment of a dog kennel in the Township provided that the owner of the kennel complies with all aspects of applicable government legislation and regulations, specifically the *Dog Owner's Liability Act* and all applicable Municipal Bylaws and does not interfere with neighbouring property owners' ability to enjoy their property.
